Proactively Dealing With Gender Confusion


Empowering Parents To "Train Up" Their Own Children

Introduction

"God is not a God of confusion..." (1 Cor. 14:33). Every child is "...fearfully and wonderfully made" (Ps. 139: 14). Parents are challenged to "Train up a child in the way he should go..." Psalm 139: 13-16


Parents Responsible

Identity

A child's "identity" is established by his/her relationship with Jesus and reinforced by parental "mutual respect" for gender roles and differences; then boys and girls are free to celebrate interests and talents apart from any "norms" or expectations.



Throughout the Old and New Testaments, God challenges us to become "healthy" by caring for the needs of others. A child/teen who is connected to a serving group of peers, or family members, grows in his/her gender confidence and personal identity.




Church Support

Because of the "risk" of offending parents, or "empowering" children's ministry or youth ministry team members to address the issues, it is better, in the long run, to create a series of parent support "tools" (seminars, printed materials, counseling, etc.) to strengthen the parents to deal with the issue themselves, at home.

Printed Support

A series of easy-to-read pamphlets that address the critical fears and needs of today's parents. These pamphlets strongly identify Jesus as the source of our "identity," while providing practical support for the parents.



Parent Seminars

A series of parent support seminars specifically-targeted toward gender identity. Each of the seminars would include a strong emphasis, and training in, leading their own children to Jesus. The seminars would provide practical ideas for nurturing a healthy gender identity as well as following Biblical principles for successful parenting. Parent support networks would be fostered during each seminar.

Counseling

Specific counseling for parents who deal with gender confusion in their children. The counseling would provide immediate support, while encouraging the parents to attend the parent seminars. The church might also carefully consider counseling for children or youth.
